

Q Tip Apple Art Project

Trace the apple pattern with a pencil for the apple on a piece of white construction paper. Carefully cut along the stem line and lift a bit to trace. I glue the traced apple to a slightly large sized black or dark blue piece of construction paper for a frame. You can do this after the children paint or before.

I put green, brown and red tempera paint on a paper plate or pie plate--separate plates!. Have plenty of Q Tips on hand. They tend to get a bit "fuzzy" after a few dots. The children are given instructions ahead of time where to use the different colors of paint. I tell them to put the dots very close together to make it look like an apple. I use printed Avery peel off stickers in size 1/2" x 1 3/4" to put their names on the apples. I use these apples for a bulletin board display and then save them for their Memory books afterwards.

Cut template along this curved line and lift to trace. Trace on white construction paper with pencil.
